Where did the theme come from?

The theme of this year's Life & Light in the Western Region photographic competition is "Rocks, Rust, Stars and Dust" to coincide with this year's Rural Women's Gathering hosted in Broken Hill. The theme was inspired by the incredible western landscape (rocks), the history of this region (rust), the incredible night skies (stars) and the red earth that has come to characterize the west (dust).

The Western Local Land Services Region:

- · covers more than 40% of NSW
- has a population of approximately 43,000 people
- is the largest and most diverse of the Local Land Services areas in NSW
- is home to the entire Barwon-Darling River System and is bordered by the Murray and Murrumbidgee rivers in the south
- is a predominantly flat area interrupted by stony ridges and ranges
- contains many sites of cultural significance and 16 current Aboriginal language groups.

What will the judges be looking for?

The judges will be looking for images taken within the Western Region, no earlier than 2014. The more you know about the region you live in, the more chances you have of taking a prize-winning picture! Here are some ideas to help you impress the panel:

- photographs that show a passion for buildings or the surrounding landscape
- photographs that portray a sense of belonging and connection to a place and/or landscape
- · native plants and animals in their natural habitat
- · vibrant use of colour or contrast
- · the Western Region's land and water systems
- photographs that portray significant landscapes and landmarks from our region
- photographs of people interacting with their landscape

Rules of entry

- 1. Entries close at 5pm on Friday 30 September 2016.
- 2. Entries should be emailed to lifeandlightphotocomp@gmail.com with the entry form and digital copies of your photos attached image files must be named in accordance with the photo title on the entry form.
- 3. Hard copies will not be accepted, although if you are unable to email photos, a USB stick with photos and entry form can be mailed or dropped in to Martha Gouniai LLS Lvl 3, 32 Sulphide St Broken Hill, NSW 2880.
- 4. Subject matter is restricted to the locality of the Western Region and should address the theme of this year's competition: "Rocks, Rust, Stars & Dust".
- 5. Photographs should have been taken no earlier than January 2014, must be unpublished and should not have won any other competition open to the general public.
- 6. Entries will be limited to 4 photos per category per person. Any photos entered in excess of this will not be considered.
- 7. The copyright of each entry submitted remains with the photographer, however, Western Local Land Services reserve the right to use any entry for promotional purposes. Far West Rural Supplies reserves the right to use any shortlisted photos from the People's Choice category. Western Landcare NSW reserves the right to use any photo entered into the Sustainable Agriculture category.
- 8. The judges' decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into. The judges are made up of one member of the LLS Western Board; one member of the WLNSW Steering Committee; one representative of Far West Rural Supplies Broken Hill; one member of West Darling Arts; and a representative of the Rural Women's Gathering.
- Notification of shortlisted nominations will be sent via email and a phone call as well as being
 published on the Local Land Services Western Region and WLNSW websites and Facebook
 pages.
- 10. Prizes will be awarded as set out for each category to winners and second place. A 'Highly Commended' prize for each category will also be presented.
- 11. The Life and Light in the Western Region Photographic Competition 2016 is open to ALL interested persons except judges of the competition; professional photographers; Western Local Land Services employees and their immediate family (householders) and Western Local Land Services Board members.

Professional photographers, for the purposes of this competition, are deemed to be:

- A person who has an active Australian Business Number, and the main stream of business for that ABN is photography
- A person who promotes themselves as a professional photographer (eg has business cards and/or advertises their services)
- 12. Digital images must be a medium to high resolution and emailed (along with entry form) to lifeandlightphotocomp@gmal.com image files must be named.
- 13. Each photograph must be accompanied with the entrant's name, address, contact telephone number(s), the title, location and approximate date of the photograph and category it is entered into.

The best works are selected according to the technique, creativivity and emotional aspects of the work. The designs are considered for their degree of freshness, aesthetic qualities, functionality and charm.
